Human IgG1 Fc (C103S, L117A, L118A) Protein, His Tag (IG1-H52H6) is expressed from human 293 cells (HEK293). It contains AA Pro 100 - Lys 330 (Accession # P01857-1 (C103S, L117A, L118A)).

Predicted N-terminus: Pro 100

Molecular Characterization



This protein carries a polyhistidine tag at the C-terminus.

The protein has a calculated MW of 27.8 kDa. The protein migrates as 33-35 kDa when calibrated against <u>Star Ribbon Pre-stained Protein Marker</u> under reducing (R) condition (SDS-PAGE) due to glycosylation.

Endotoxin

Less than 1.0 EU per µg by the LAL method.

Purity

>95% as determined by SDS-PAGE.

Formulation

Lyophilized from $0.22~\mu m$ filtered solution in 50~mM Tris, 100~mM Glycine, 25~mM Arginine, 150~mM NaCl, pH7.5 with trehalose as protectant.

Storage


For long term storage, the product should be stored at lyophilized state at -20 $^{\circ}$ C or lower.

Please avoid repeated freeze-thaw cycles.

This product is stable after storage at:

- -20°C to -70°C for 12 months in lyophilized state;
- -70°C for 3 months under sterile conditions after reconstitution.



Immobilized Human IgG1 Fc (C103S, L117A, L118A) Protein, His Tag (Cat. No. IG1-H52H6) at 5 μ g/mL (100 μ L/well) can bind Biotinylated Human CD64, His,Avitag (Cat. No. FCA-H82E8) with a linear range of 0.2-8 ng/mL (QC tested).

Background

Crystallizable fragments composed of the carboxy-terminal halves of both IMMUNOGLOBULIN HEAVY CHAINS linked to each other by disulfide bonds. Fc fragments contain the carboxy-terminal parts of the heavy chain constant regions that are responsible for the effector functions of an immunoglobulin (COMPLEMENT fixation, binding to the cell membrane via FC RECEPTORS, and placental transport). IgG1 Fc was reported has a novel role as a potential anti-inflammatory drug for treatment of human autoimmune diseases.
