# **Molecular Characterization**

This protein carries a human IgG1 Fc tag at the C-terminus.

The protein has a calculated MW of 130.1 kDa. The protein migrates as 65-80 kDa,95-120 kDa and 160-180 kDa when calibrated against <u>Star Ribbon Pre-</u><u>stained Protein Marker</u> under reducing (R) condition (SDS-PAGE) due to glycosylation.



# Mouse IGF-I R / CD221 Protein, Fc Tag

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Immobilized Mouse IGF-I R Protein, Fc Tag (Cat. No. IGR-M5253) at 5  $\mu$ g/mL (100  $\mu$ L/well) can bind Biotinylated Human IGF-I, Avitag,Fc Tag (Cat. No. IG1-H82F7) with a linear range of 0.039-1.25  $\mu$ g/mL (QC tested).

#### Background

The Insulin-like Growth Factor 1 Receptor (IGF1) is also known as CD221, JTK13. and is a transmembrane receptor that is activated by IGF-1 and by the related growth factor IGF-2. It belongs to the large class of tyrosine kinase receptors. This receptor mediates the effects of IGF-1, which is a polypeptide protein hormone similar in molecular structure to insulin. IGF1R is make up of two alpha subunits and two beta subunits ,the Both the  $\alpha$  and  $\beta$  subunits are synthesized from a single mR precursor. The precursor is then glycosylated, proteolytically cleaved, and crosslinked by cysteine bonds to form a functional transmembrane  $\alpha\beta$  chain. The  $\alpha$  chains are located extracellularly while the  $\beta$  subunit spans the membrane and are responsible for intracellular signal transduction upon ligand stimulation. IGF1R have a binding site for ATP, which is used to provide the phosphates for autophosphorylation. There is a 60% homology between IGF1R and the insulin receptor. In response to ligand binding, the  $\alpha$  chains induce the tyrosine autophosphorylation of the  $\beta$  chains. This event triggers a cascade of intracellular signaling that, while somewhat cell type specific, often promotes cell survival and cell proliferation.
